### Parking:



This is a recurring problem. Thank you to those parents who always park considerately.

Please be aware that the yellow zig zags are there for the safety of all children in school. **They should NOT be parked on.** This applies even if you are just popping into school to drop your child off. Please park further away from school and walk down or up the hill. **This is for the safety of all of our children.**

Even though there aren't zigzags in the middle of the turning circle, please do not park there. This is a space for cars to turn around.

### Midday assistants:

We are looking for some midday assistants to help the children eating in the dinner hall and supervise them outside during lunch time. The hours are from 11.50 – 1.05 every day Monday – Friday. If you, or anyone you know, is interested please ask for an application form and job description at the office.

### Healthy Snacks / Drinking bottles:

Please remember that we have a policy of only allowing water in bottles that are drunk in class. Children on packed lunches may bring juice for lunch time but this should only be drunk at lunchtime and not throughout the day. This has been our policy for several years.

For the last year, we have asked children to have a piece of fruit or veg for their morning snack. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with this through the government fruit scheme. Children in Year 3-6 can pay £1 a week for us to provide them with a snack or bring one from home. Some packed lunch children are helping themselves to something from their lunch box at morning play time. Please help to support us to promote healthy eating by either sending a snack separately or by ensuring there is a piece of fruit or veg for them to take out at morning playtime. Thank you for your support.

### PE Kits:

Please remember that all children need a PE kit in school. From Reception to Class 5 they all need a change of t-shirt, shorts / leggings and pumps. We expect all children to change for PE. If girls are wearing tights for school, it can be useful to keep some socks in their PE bags. PE kits can be left at school on children's pegs for the half term as they don't get that sweaty.



### Football match against St Peter's RC Stalybridge:

Last Friday our team played St Peter's in Stalybridge. Despite being 5-0 down at half time, the final score was 6-3. Congratulations to Matthew who scored all three goals. The whole team showed real determination and perseverance and really supported one another and played as a team. Well done to Matthew, Finn, Isaac, Gracie, Daniel, Elliot, Connor and Celestin.

### Times Tables:

It's really important that children know their times tables off by heart. The expectations in the National Curriculum are as follows:

**By the end of Year 2:** 2, 5 and 10 times tables and their related division facts.

**By the end of Year 3:** (As above plus) 3, 4 and 8 times tables and their related division facts.

**By the end of Year 4:** all of the times tables up to 12 x 12 and their related division facts.

**Years 5 and 6:** the children should consolidate their speed of mental recall for all multiplication and division facts.

All children from Y2-6 have a log in for Times Tables Rock Stars which helps children to practice their tables on line. When playing the game the children create their own personal rockstar character. The more they play and the more questions they answer correctly they earn 'virtual money' or 'coins'. The children are then able to purchase items to enhance their character. The children learn their times tables in an entertaining and engaging way! We'd recommend Children practice on this game most evenings for just a short period of time.

### Holidays:

Please remember that school does not authorise term-time holidays. An absence of 5 days from school (10 registration sessions) can mean that a fine will be issued from Tameside. We promote good attendance in school as we believe this supports children to make the best possible progress.

### Mini First Aid Course:
