Parking:

We have had complaints this week from local residents about parking. Unsafe and inconsiderate parking does not help us to retain good relations with our local neighbours and being part of the local community is something that we believe is important. I also need to remind parents and carers that double parking on the turning circle is dangerous. The turning circle is there to allow cars to turn around. If people park in this space, this causes an obstruction and will cause other parents to turn around in a more dangerous position. It also poses another obstacle for pedestrians. Please can I ask that all parents and carers consider our local residents and park with consideration even if it is just for a short time.

Free Qustodio monitoring on children's devices:

Qustodio allows Tameside families the access to be able to filter and block 2 devices for free for ever. So parents can monitor websites children are accessing, set screen time limits and many other things. Just scan the QR code below to set up your access. In a family with 2 adults, each one can do this for 2 devices allowing you free control on 4 devices. We strongly recommend that this is set up and used.

Akeru Aikido is a Tomiki Aikido Club for children with additional needs or emerging additional needs. It is a volunteer-led community club.

The purpose of Akeru Aikido club is to provide a safe, friendly, open and inclusive environment for additional needs children who would otherwise be at risk of social isolation the chance to learn a new skill, gain confidence, build on advocating for themselves and make new lasting friendships allowing them to find their tribe.

Meet The Coach behind Akeru Aikido

Hi, my name is Alex and I am the instructor who founded Akeru Aikido in August 2023.

I started Tomiki Aikido in 2006.I am an experienced coach, and have

What I love about Tomiki Aikido is that the competitive nature of the art allows anyone of any age and ability the chance to show and prove no just to the outer world but also to themselves what they can truly achieve with hard work, focus and discipline



How did Akeru Aikido begin?

My own daughter Sarah has complex needs and I felt that with the right adaptions and accommodations Aikido provided a huge range of benefits for children like Sarah. Like all forms of martial arts Tomiki Aikido helps build fitness, discipline, focus and teamwork.

The difficulty was that a mainstream martial arts class would not be able to meet Sarah's needs. So after teaching her a little at home the answer became clear- make the class fit the needs of the child. And to the concept of Akeru Alkido began to grow and develop. The club started as a summer holiday class in August 2023 and has grown

At Akeru Aikido more than just Tomiki Aikido is learnt, and the child-led sessions provide the chance for additional needs children to work, train and establish meaningful friendships with children like themselves












Trans Pennine Trail - Easter Activity Pack
