Clubs:

Online Safety:

Following a Local Authority online safety, we need to make parents and carers aware that there has been a reported increase nationally of young people struggling with their mental health due to increased misuse and prevalence of technology and issues associated with this.

Online bullying and the increased usage of online messaging apps, such as snapchat and omegle, which enable people to talk to strangers and take inappropriate photos and videos are the root cause of a number of serious incidents. Lots of apps (such as snapchat etc) are used to share images and these then disappear and so become difficult / impossible to track down and remove.

More than ever, it is vitally important that parents and carers are aware of what their children are doing on their devices and what information they are sharing. Every week, we include information on our newsletter with links to approved websites that help parents/carers understand the risks of certain web sites, apps and media. We also talk to children in school as part of the PHSE and computing curriculum about the dangers of certain online activity but we cannot look at or monitor anything that belongs to children in school. That is the responsibility of all our parents.

Should your child post an inappropriate image or video of themselves on any platform, there is a high risk that that image or video could be copied and subsequently re-posted elsewhere. It's therefore important to act quickly to remove it. Below are links to help you remove inappropriate images and also to report any harmful/inappropriate content.

This tool is recommended by Smoothwall and Tameside Safeguarding to help parents monitor activity, set time limits and locate devices/family members. **It is available for free for 2 mobile phone devices per adult.** For an annual subscription of £39.99 you can use it on 5 devices and also filter content and apps, track calls and text messages and get reports/alerts/SOS messages.

We would strongly recommend that you download the free element of this tool as a minimum and talk to your children about being safe and appropriate online. We would also recommend regular monitoring of devices, remove devices from bedrooms overnight and take that opportunity to check what your child is doing online, who they are talking to etc.

Tackling Online Hate:

A final recommendation is tackling online hate. Please use attached link with your child - it is a quiz to help children consider what is and isn't appropriate online.
