#### <u>Clubs:</u>

#### School Dinners / Packed Lunches:

Please make sure you inform the office (in person or by email) of any changes to your child's school dinners or packed lunch routine. For any changes between the two we need a week's notice.

Please can we ask that parents and carers cut grapes, cherry tomatoes and strawberries in half lengthways when preparing packed lunches. This is particularly for the younger children in Nursery, Reception and Year 1 as at this age, whole food like this can pose a choking hazard. Thank you.

#### Water and Snacks:

Just a reminder that children should have a water bottle that contains only water for drinking during the day. Juice is allowed in packed lunches but only at lunchtime. For a snack at playtime, we ask that children only bring in fruit and vegetables and don't help themselves to other things out of packed lunch boxes.

#### Parents needing to speak to teachers:

Please can we remind parents not to come into the building at the start or end of the day. If you need to speak to the class teacher and they aren't on the door, please ask whoever is on the door to ask them to come out rather than coming into the building yourself. Your support is appreciated.

#### Debate competition at Mossley Hollins:

We took a team of Year 5 and 6 to a debate competition at MHHS on Thursday. They were debating the issue 'This house believes Manchester should have a clean air zone' and were arguing for the idea. 
#### Charity Bags:



Come and join us this half term for some Fairytale fun!


We've got crafts, games and treasure hunts to keep you busy. The sessions are free and there's no need to book- just drop in.

BookTrust Storytime is at Denton Library this February. There will be stories, rhymes and crafts suitable for under 5's and their families. No need to book, just turn up.




