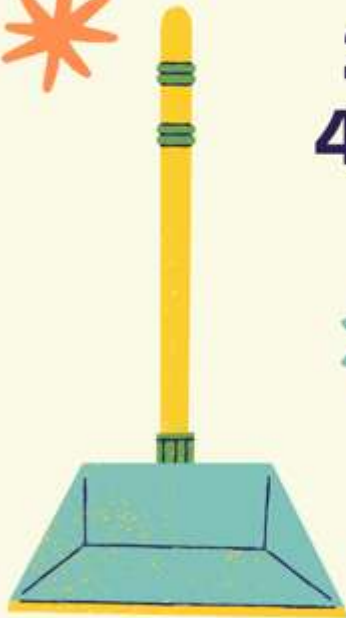

Trans Pennine Trail Easter Activity Pack
